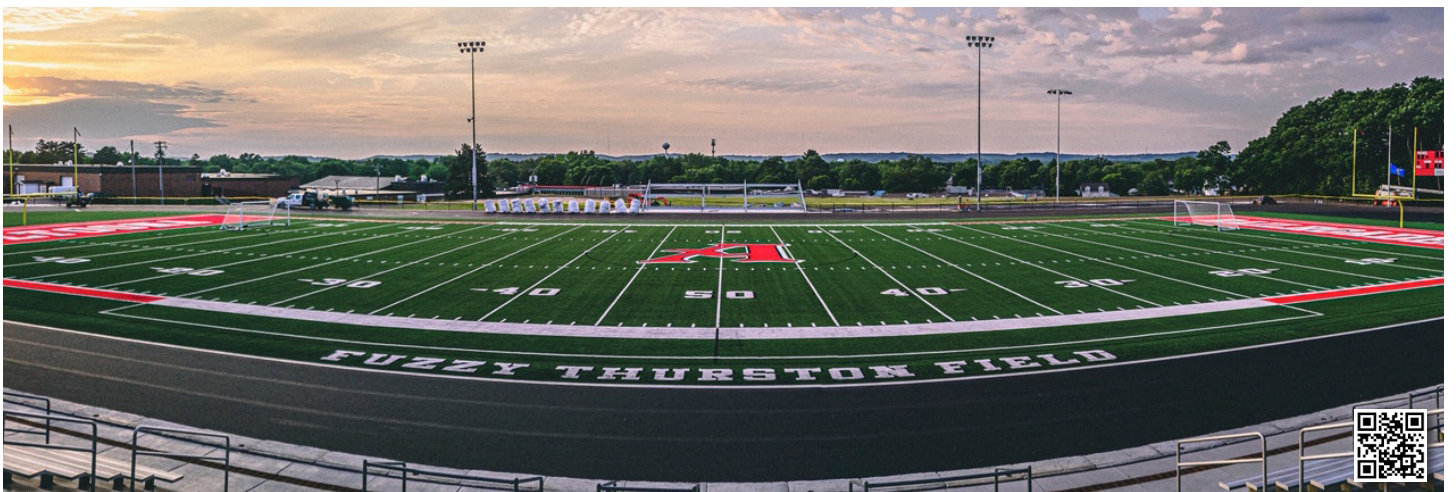

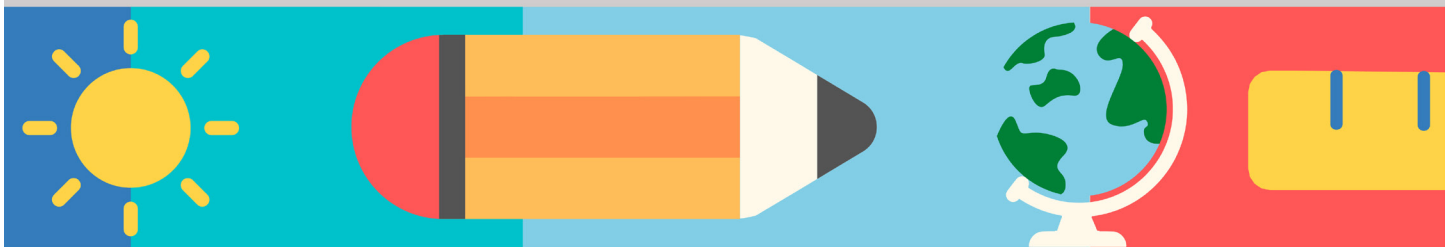
this district newsletter. In it you will find dates and information about the start of the 2021-2022 school year. We hope you will find this resource useful.

WELCOME BACK STUDENTS!



Grades 4K - 8

Students in grades 4K through eighth and their parents/guardians will attend "Welcome Back to School Day" on Wednesday, September 1st. As a required school day, students and Parents/Guardians should plan to spend 30 to 60 minutes at school between 8:00 AM-1:00 PM or 3:30 PM-5:30 PM (choose a time that is convenient for your family). Additional information will be sent from the student's school. The first full day of school for Kindergarten-8th will be Thursday, September 2nd and Tuesday, September 7th for 4K (half days).

Grades 9 - 12

Freshmen students (grade 9) will attend a full-day orientation on Wednesday, September 1st. Bus transportation will be available for ninth grade students on this date.

The First day of School for High School students grades 10 through 12 is Thursday, September 2nd.

The first day of school is almost here! We are looking forward to a healthy and safe opening of our 2021-2022 school year. When students and staff return in September, you will see the following:

Masks as optional for all students, staff, and visitors.

School monitoring of absence patterns and trends.

At-home screening for symptoms for all unvaccinated students, staff, and visitors.

A 6-12 100% virtual option for students who would like this option for any reason.

Access and instruction for hand-washing and hand-sanitizing.

Continued communication to families.

Free lunch provided to all students through federal grants.



At-Home Screening for Symptoms

Unvaccinated staff and students are required to screen for symptoms prior to coming to school. Unvaccinated students and staff should stay home if their screening reveals any following symptoms that cannot be explained by other causes (such as seasonal allergies). A temperature over 100.3 Fahrenheit within the last 48 hours, Cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or sore throat within the last 48 hours, A new loss of taste or smell, Muscle pain or chills, Illness symptoms including vomiting, diarrhea, continuous nasal drainage, or rash in the last 48 hours

All students and staff (vaccinated or not) with a temperature over 100.3 Fahrenheit within the last 48 hours are recommended to stay home from school when they have a fever.

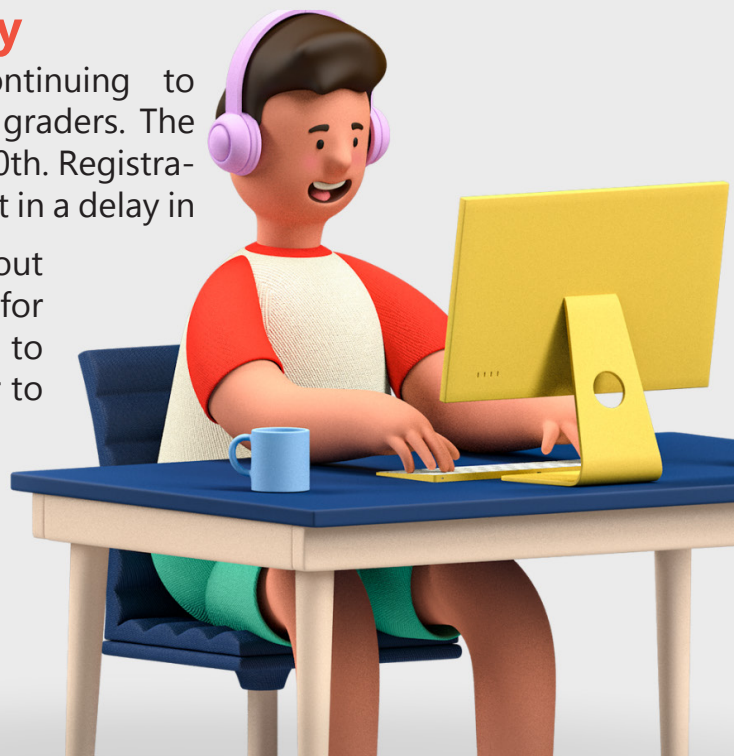

CHILD DEVELOPMENT DAY U P D A T E

Dear Families:

The following is a letter regarding past practices of Child Development Day and Child Find activities in our school district. Recently, the School District of Altoona has discussed best practices when it comes to Child Find activities. Upon receiving guidance from the U.S. Office of Special Education Programs and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, we have decided to refine our process to be more in line with a "comprehensive child find system."

Comprehensive child find systems are ongoing efforts to support families in the understanding and awareness of developmental needs, from birth to 21 years of age, therefore, recognizing children with disabilities.

As a result of this shift, for children ages 3 and up, until they enter kindergarten, we will no longer be holding a Child Development Day, as we have done in the past. Rather, we will be sending the *Ages and Stages Questionnaires*, Third Edition (ASQ-3) form home for families to complete, relative to their day to day observations of their child. If you have a child in this range, please look for this questionnaire to be delivered by US Mail to your mailbox by the end of September. Once complete, please mail the form back to Altoona Elementary School or drop off in the office for Kathy Roen, Early Childhood Teacher. Once received, the school district will do the following:

- 1] Score the assessment
- 2] Summarize and provide explanation of results
- 3] Provide resources to support the continued development of your child



A Message from Student Transit

Student Transit would like to welcome you and your child to the 2021-2022 school year! We look forward to serving the families of the School District of Altoona each year. We understand the excitement and apprehension the very first day of school brings to students and parents/guardians. It is our goal to make this day, as well as every day, a safe and pleasant experience.

Our staff is available each day, so please do not hesitate to contact us with any questions or concerns. Know that any issues that come up should also be mentioned to your driver, as they are the first contact. During the school year, our staff is available to answer your questions from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM and 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM during the summer months (715-839-5116).

To ensure your child has a safe, efficient and enjoyable ride to and from school each day, please take the time to read over the following information.

-  Communicate to Student Transit any health issues, such as peanut or bee allergy, that would be important for us to know, or if your child is Special Needs. Direct communication with our office staff and your student's driver ensures your child will receive the support necessary for a positive school bus experience.
-  Go over the bus expectations and discuss riding safely. Your efforts will help us reinforce good bus rider behavior.
-  Write your child's name, address and phone number inside of their backpack and jacket.
-  Please have your child ride the bus the first few days of school if they will normally ride each day. This will help us get to know your student, establish the routine of the route, and help your child become more comfortable riding the bus each day.
-  Please be patient if your child's bus is running a few minutes late the first few days of school. We want to give our newest riders the time to say goodbye if needed.
-  For those with a Kindergarten student, please remind them to sit at the front. This helps our driver get to know and to help remind them when we reach their stop.
-  If you wish to allow your child to ride home with a friend, please call or send a written request with your child. This must be signed by the school office. Without written permission your child will not be allowed to be dropped anywhere except their designated stop.
-  Most locations will be at corners. Unless your child is the only one at a pick up location, there's no need to call us if they won't be riding. To help keep the bus on schedule, please be sure that students are at the bus stop a few minutes prior to pick up.
-  It is important to let us know of any changes in pick up or drop off locations.

Bus schedules will be sent out in August, but putting routes together for thousands of kids can be challenging! If you have not received your bus schedule the week prior to school starting, please call us.
