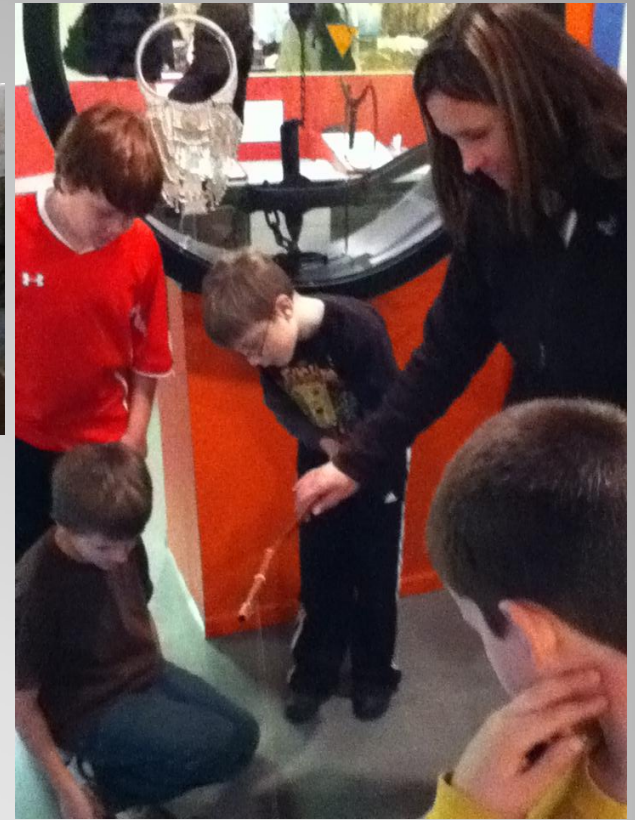

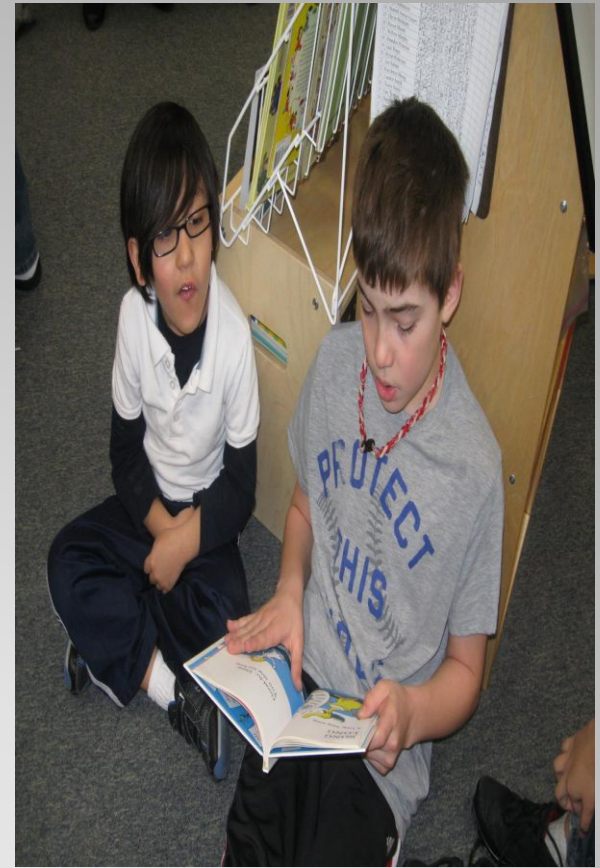

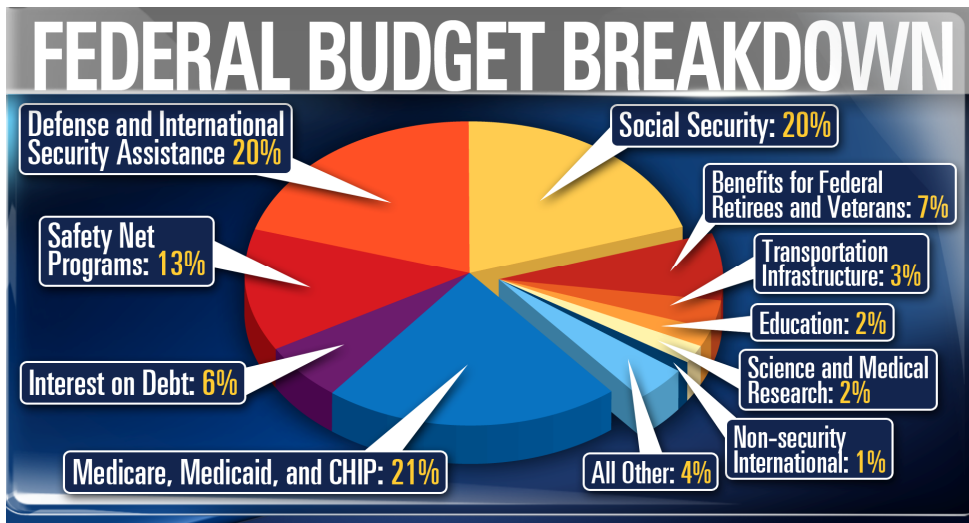

As a district we are moving forward with PLC (Professional Learning Community) training and development. While we already have a number of collaborative components in place, the PLC framework will help us advance the district vision - and leverage our resources as we work to continually improve outcomes for students via the Common Core Standards and the Smarter Balanced Assessment.

### 2012/13 Book Study: Learning by Doing:

All district teachers will attend the August 27 PLC inservice by Tim Brown (Solutions Tree) so that we will all have a common foundation and be able to use the information presented as a reference point throughout the school year and beyond.

#### *Six Characteristics of PLC's:*

- Shared mission, vision, and values
- Collaborative teams
- Collective inquiry
- Action orientation/experimentation
- Commitment to continuous improvement
- Results orientation

#### *PLCs work to answer 4 key questions:*

- What do we want our students to learn?
- How will we know when they have learned it?
- How will we respond when some students don't learn?
- How will we respond when students already know it?

Educational research conducted by Robert Marzano, Richard DuFour and many others indicates, overwhelmingly, that collaborative practices that focus on the four key questions, have an incredibly positive impact on improving student learning and improve the collective capacity of a group to achieve intended results. The degree to which people work together in a coordinated, focused effort is a major determinant to the effectiveness of any organization.
