- Roll call was taken and the following were present: Helen S. Drawbert, President Robert (Red) A. Hanks, Vice President/Treasurer Robin E. Elvig, Clerk Michael J. Hilger, Member

- 3. Reading of Public Notice. Report of notice was given. All posting requirements were met and posting places are noted: Altoona City Hall, Altoona Post Office, school district office, high school office, middle school office, and elementary school office.
- 4. Pledge of Allegiance
- 5. TED Talk Preview. TED Talk: Ann Cooper talks school lunches was previewed. Joyce will share the link with board members.
- 6. Superintendent's Transition Plan. Dr. Biedron reviewed her updated transition plan covering the categories of communications, finance, human relations, office of the superintendent and student learning. Areas of significant discussion with the board included communications, safety priorities, use of space and reorganization. One of Dr. Biedron's communication efforts will be ongoing "Coffee with Connie," sessions at the Altoona Family Restaurant. Board members suggested that one of them could join her from time to time. The board would also like increased written communications in the form of a newsletter. The concept of an intermediate school (grades 4-5) was also discussed as it pertains to student learning. This concept would work well under a project based learning structure. Looping is also of interest to the board. School safety priorities (locked doors, ID badges, office staffing) will be established and reinforced this school year. The policy committee will work on policy development.
- 7. September Board-Administrative Retreat. The board and administration will meet in September. Topics of discussion will include board-administrative relations and chain of command. Deb Gurke, WASB Director of Governance and Leadership Development will facilitate. Potential dates are September 10, 11 or 26.
- 8. 2012/13 Priorities and Considerations to Address Priorities. The Priorities and Considerations chart was reviewed. The chart identifies areas of need (clerical support, class size/offerings, staff development, technology, leadership) and considerations to address them. Other ideas include finding a STEP worker to greet in the District Office, establishing a staff development library, establishing a technology help desk staffed by students, and a technology tutor program. Other priorities noted: increased staff development funding, keeping libraries open and incorporating community service requirements into the curriculum.

- 9. New State Report Cards and Changes to Assessment Reporting Scores. Technical report card samples for elementary schools, middle schools, and high schools were included in board packets. In addition, Altoona's Predictive Data for State Report Card and Wisconsin's Initiative Timeline were presented. The timeline shows the relationship of the Common Core Standards, Balanced Assessment and Response to Intervention (RtI), all leading to the Smarter Balanced Assessment in 2014/15, educator effectiveness and school and district accountability.
- 10. Preliminary Discussion of Timeline and Process for Handbook Development. The board will begin discussing and identifying priorities in January. Work with staff on handbooks will begin after identifying areas as either "firm" or open to discussion.
- 11. Preliminary Discussion of Merit Pay. Merit pay plans will be reviewed at another meeting. Dr. Biedron will look into whether or not merit pay is required, and if so, the timeline for implementing.
- 12. Preliminary Discussion of Future Facilities Planning Use of Space. See #6.
- 13. Update on High School Student Council President's Proposal. The student council president may be submitting another proposal to Mr. Pepowski.
- 14. Review of Referendum Survey and Next Step. Joyce will email the results to board members.

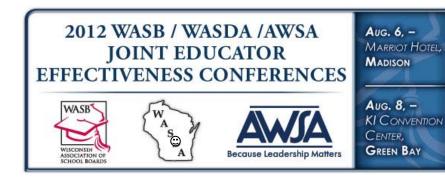

How The HRA Works

Participant uses the health plan.

Doctor sends bill for services to WEA.

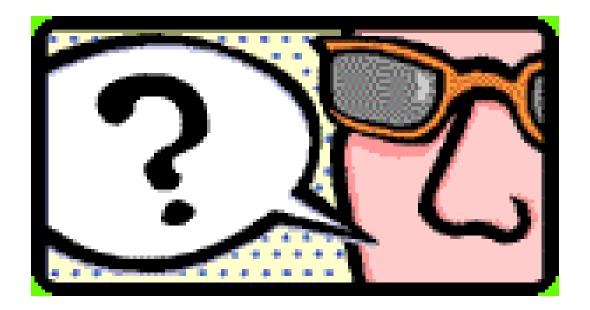

About 2011 Wisconsin Act 114 (Senate Bill 2)

2011 Wisconsin Act 114 (Senate Bill 2) was enacted by the state legislature and signed into law by the governor. The new law was effective immediately when it was published by the secretary of state. The bill:

- Extends the open enrollment application period from three weeks to three months.
- Provides the following exceptions to the open enrollment application period:
 - o For students who have been the victim of a violent criminal offense.
 - o For students who have been homeless in the current or immediately preceding school year.
 - o For students who have been the victim of repeated bullying or harassment.
 - o For students whose place of residence has changed as a result of military orders.
 - For students who have moved into the state.
 - For students whose place of residence has changed as a result of a court order or custody agreement or who have been placed in or removed from a foster home or a person other than the pupil's parent.
 - o If the student's parent, the nonresident district and the resident district all agree the transfer is in the best interest of the child.

The resident school board may only deny an application for the following reasons:

- The resident school district determines that the criteria relied on by the applicant does not apply to the student.
- The cost to provide the special education and related services in the nonresident school district constitutes an undue financial burden to the resident district in light of its total economic circumstances
- The resident school district does not agree that the transfer is in the best interest of the child.

The resident district **may not deny** an application if it is based on the resident school district's finding that the student has been the victim of a violent crime.

Parents Right to Appeal:

If the resident district denies the application, the parent may file an appeal with the department within 30 days of receiving the notice of denial. The department must affirm the resident school board's decision unless it determines that the decision was arbitrary or unreasonable. If the resident district denied the application because it determined the transfer is not in the best interests of the student, the department must base its decision on the best interests of the student.

The nonresident school board may only deny an application for the following reasons:

A nonresident school district may deny open enrollment for the following reasons:

- Space is not available in the school, program, class or grade the student would attend.
 [Wis. Stats. § 118.51 (5) (a) 1.]
- The student is currently expelled and the expulsion will extend into the school year for which the application is submitted. [Wis. Stats. § 120.13 (1) (f)]
- The student has been expelled during the current or preceding two school years for certain conduct specified in statute. [Wis. Stats. § 118.51 (5) (a) 2.]
- The student was habitually truant from the nonresident district during any semester in the current or previous school year. [Wis. Stats. § 118.51 (5) (a) 3.]
- The special education or related services required by the student's individualized education program (IEP) are not available in the nonresident school district or there is no space in the special education or related services required by the student's IEP. [Wis. Stats. § 118.51 (5) (a) 4.]
- The student has been referred for a special education evaluation but has not been evaluated. [Wis. Stats. § 118.51 (5) (a) 6.]

The membership of the Board of Education shall consist of five members.

Before taking office, school board members shall sign the following oath or affirmation:

"State of Wisconsin, County of Eau Claire,

I, the undersigned, who have been elected (or appointed) to the office of school board member, but have not yet entered upon the duties thereof, swear (or affirm) that I will support the constitution of the United States and the constitution of the state of Wisconsin, and will faithfully discharge the duties of said office to the best of my ability.

Subscribed and sworn to before me this ... day of ..., (year)."

In addition, before taking office, school board members shall orally recite the following oath:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the constitution of the United States and the constitution of the state of Wisconsin, and that I will honestly, faithfully discharge my duties as a school board member to the best of my ability."

Board members shall make reasonable efforts to be informed in the field of education by attending appropriate meetings and conventions and by following current educational developments. In particular, school board members are expected to make attendance at WASB workshops and conferences a priority.

BOARD MEMBERS ELECTIONS

Policy 131 (formerly BBB)

Qualified electors of the district shall elect school board members at the regular spring election held the first Tuesday in April at the regular polling places used for state and local judicial elections.

The term of office shall be for three years or for the unexpired term of a candidate unable to fulfill a full term. The term shall begin on the fourth (4th) Monday in April following said election.

The names shall be placed on the ballot according to the Wisconsin Statute 120.06(8)(b).

Within 24 hours after the polls close, the appointed Board of Canvassers shall canvass the votes.

BOARD VACANCIES Policy 133

(combines policies formerly labeled BBE, BBE-E, BBC)

Cause of Vacancies

Board Member Resignation: If for reasons of health, change in domicile, or any other compelling reason a board member decides to terminate service, the Board requests earliest possible notification of intent to resign so that the Board may plan appropriately for this exigency.

Resignations shall be made in writing and delivered to the Board Clerk. The resignation shall take effect at the time indicated in the written resignation, or if no time is therein indicated, then upon delivery of the resignation.

Removal of Board Member: Board members may be removed from office for cause by the judge of the circuit court having jurisdiction over the school district.

Filling Vacancies

Appointments: Vacancies on the Board are filled by appointment made by the remaining members of the Board. A notice of any vacancy will be published both in the Board meeting minutes when the vacancy occurs, and a three day ad will be published in the local newspaper. Any prospective candidate shall review the policies on Board Member Qualifications and submit a letter of interest to the school board president before the next regular board meeting. All letters will be placed on the agenda for review. The Board may elect to conduct interviews with potential candidates.

The person appointed shall hold office until a successor is elected at a regular Board election.

Temporary Vacancies for Military Leave: If a board member enters the armed forces of the United States and removes himself or herself temporarily from the school district, such temporary removal shall constitute a temporary vacancy of office.

Temporary vacancies shall be filled as other vacancies are filled, except that no election need be held to fill any part of a temporary vacancy. The term of the person appointed shall not extend beyond the expiration of the term of the board member who entered federal service. In the event the original board member completes the federal service and returns to the district during his or her original term of office, the board member may file with the clerk of the district or municipality, within 40 days of completing the federal service, a statement under oath that the federal service has terminated and that the board member elects to resume office. Upon the filing of the statement the term of the temporary board member shall cease, and the returning board member shall be entitled to resume the duties of the office.

Candidate Evaluation Worksheet

In evaluating a candidate, the Board will consider the individual's:

- 1. Desire to serve; evidence of past interest in school activities.
- 2. Interest in children.
- 3. Involvement with other community efforts.
- 4. Knowledge of schools, board organizations, and board responsibilities.
- 5. Government experience.
- 6. Understanding of school board duties.
- 7. Ability to represent the entire community.
- 8. Relationship of livelihood to board duties.
- 9. Attitude toward board teamwork.
- 10. Attitude toward board/administrative relationship.
- 11. Availability for board duties.

APPROVED:

The School Board shall elect a President, Vice President, Clerk and Treasurer from among its members to serve as officers of the Board. Board officers shall be elected annually at the organizational meeting of the Board, which is to be held on or within 30 days after the fourth (4th) Monday in April. Voting for Board officers shall be done by nomination and voice vote, unless a secret ballot process is requested. The officers shall be elected in the following order: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Clerk. A Board of Education Secretary, who need not be a member of the School Board, will be appointed annually following the Annual Meeting.

Board officers shall serve for one-year terms, from one organizational meeting until the next provided that the officer remains a member of the Board. In the event of an officer's absence or inability to act, or a Board officer vacancy, the Board shall appoint another Board member (or other eligible individual for the office of Secretary) to discharge the officer's duties using the same voting method as outlined above. When an officer is elected to fill a vacancy, the person elected to fill the vacancy shall serve until the next organizational meeting. As noted below, the Vice President shall automatically carry out the duties and responsibilities of the President in his/her temporary absence or inability to act.

Removal of any Board officer from his/her position as an officer prior to the expiration of his/her term as an officer shall be handled in accordance with the requirements of state law and district policies and rules.

Board officers shall perform the following duties:

The President shall:

- 1. Prepare the agenda for all regular and special board meetings, in consultation with the District Administrator.
- 2. Appoint all standing Board committees, whose appointments are not otherwise provided for, and any other committees as determined necessary by the Board.
- 3. Ensure that public notice is given for all meetings of the Board.
- 4. Preside at all Board meetings and see that the minutes are properly recorded, approved, and signed.
- 5. Countersign all checks and other orders for the disbursement of District funds.
- 6. Defend the District from actions brought against it and prosecute actions brought by the District.
- 7. Serve as spokesperson for the Board.
- 8. Vote on matters before the Board just as any other Board member.
- 9. Perform such other duties as required by law or assigned by the Board.

The Vice President shall:

- 1. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall act as chairperson of school board meetings.
- 2. Perform such other duties as assigned by the Board.

The Clerk shall:

- Have the care and custody of the records, books, and documents of the Board.
 Draw orders on the school district treasurer as directed by an annual or special
 meeting or the school board and record all orders drawn on the school district
 treasurer.
- 2. Shall cause to be entered in the record book provided by the Board, the minutes of its meetings, orders, resolutions, and proceedings.
- 3. Furnish each teacher with a copy of the contract between him/her and the school board.
- 4. Before the spring election, appoint two citizens at large to serve as the board canvassers. If the district clerk is a candidate at the election being canvassed, the other two members shall designate a third member.
- 5. Report the name and post office address of each officer of the school district, within ten days after the election or appointment of the officer, to the clerk and the treasurer of each municipality having territory within the school district.
- 6. Annually, as specified by statute, deliver to the clerk of each municipality a certified statement showing that proportion of the amount of taxes voted to be collected in such year, if any, for the annual payment of any loan of the school district.
- 7. Within five days after receipt of notification from the school board of the name of a new school, notify the post-master of the name and address. On school vacations, the clerk shall direct what disposition shall be made of the mail.
- 8. Have authority to administer the oath of office to school board members.
- 9. Act as clerk and record the proceedings of annual and special meetings.
- 10. Enter in the record book copies of all of the school district clerk's reports to the municipal clerks and the certificate of the proceedings of a meeting returned by a temporary school district clerk.
- 11. Perform such other duties as required by law or assigned by the Board.

The Treasurer shall:

- 1. Deposit all moneys belonging to the district in accordance with the instructions of the Board and in compliance to state law.
- 2. Apply for, receive and sue for all money appropriated to or collected for the school district and disburse the same in accordance with State Statutes 120.16(2) and 66.042. Disburse money upon written order of the clerk after vouchers have been filed.
- 3. Enter in his/her account books all money received and disbursed by him/her, specifying the source from which it was received, the person to whom it was paid and the object or which it was paid.

- 4. Present to the annual meeting a written statement of all monies received and disbursed during the preceding year.
- 5. Deposit all funds of the school district in a public depository deposit designated by the school board under State Statute 120.12(7).
- 6. Withdraw funds of the school district under State Statutes 120.16(6) and 66.042.
- 7. Perform duties in collaboration with the business manager.
- 8. Perform such other duties as required by law or assigned by the Board.

The current Board President shall have the duty of presiding over the election of officers, unless he/she is no longer on the Board, in which case the Board shall appoint a temporary chair by majority vote for purposes of presiding over the election of officers. The Board President or other presiding officer shall appoint a member of the District staff to count any paper ballots used in connection with the election process and shall then confirm repeated as many times for each office as is necessary to elect the officer, shall be as follows:

- The current Board President or other presiding officer shall make a call for nominations for the officer position to be elected. Any Board member may nominate any eligible person for the office, including him/herself. Nominations need not be seconded. Additional nominees (including nominees who previously declined nomination or who withdrew from consideration during a prior round of voting) may be added prior to each new round of voting for the office, if such additional rounds of voting are needed.
- The nominees (or any new nominee(s) added in a subsequent round of voting) shall be asked to accept or decline the nomination. If a nominee accepts the nomination, his/her name shall be included in the vote(s) for the officer position in question until such time as he/she may withdraw his/her name from consideration. If a nominee declines the nomination, his/her name is not included in the vote(s) for the position.
- Once the nominees for the particular round of voting are clearly established, a vote shall be taken by the method specified above, or by such other method as is selected by a majority vote of the Board at the outset of the organizational meeting. All Board members who are participating in the meeting, including all nominees for the officer position in question, shall cast a vote. In the event that there is only one nominee for an office, the Board may set aside any prior decision to use secret ballots by a showing of unanimous consent, and then conduct a voice vote or other type of vote to elect the officer.

If a nominee earns a majority of the votes cast for the officer position in question, that nominee shall be asked whether he/she accepts the position. If the victorious nominee accepts the position, the position is filled and the process begins anew for the next officer position until all officer positions are filled. If the victorious nominee declines the position, or if no nominee earns a majority of the votes cast, the voting process repeats for that position.

2011-2012 School Year

66.0301 Cooperative Between Menomonie School District and Altoona School District

SCHOOL BOARD RESOLUTION

"Whereas the following school districts have disabled children, and whereas it appears that the educational interests of all children in these school districts will be served best by the districts joining together to offer special services, as authorized by the Department of Public Instruction, to meet the needs of students with disabilities."

"It is hereby resolved that the school boards of Menomonie and **Altoona School District** agree to establish and maintain, on a cooperative basis, the special education services of Instructor of the **Visually Impaired**, pursuant to the Chapter PI 14, Section 66.0301 of the Wisconsin Statutes."

CONDITIONS

Pursuant to a resolution adopted by the school districts of Menomonie and **Altoona School District** mutually agree, pursuant to Section 66.0301 of the Wisconsin Statutes, to the following conditions:

- 1. That said above parties agree and contract for the cooperation of the special education service, Teacher of the Visually Impaired, as hereinafter set forth;
- 2. That the School District of the Menomonie Area be the operator and fiscal agent;
- 3. That Menomonie, as the fiscal agent, will include all program expenditures and receipts in Fund 27 of the Wisconsin Uniform Financial Accounting Requirements (WUFAR).
- 4. That the cost to the participating districts district be determined prior to June 30th, annually, on the basis of participation and state aid reimbursements determined in the same manner and paid to the participating school districts;
- 5. That estimated budget and plan of operation for this cooperative shall be approved in advance of contract signing by all school district parties hereto;
- 6. That variations from the budget will require prior approval of the participating school districts hereto;
- 7. That unemployment compensation for the Special Education instructor will be the responsibility of the participating districts and based on percentage of use;
- 8. That the participating district agrees to prepay the host district according to the following schedule: Two installments-the first beginning in October 2010 and the second in February 2011. Billings will reflect 50% of the original estimated budget. An audited statement revealing

- either balances due or refunds will be issued to **Altoona School District** after the determination of actual program costs.
- 9. That Menomonie, as the fiscal agent, agrees to file the required financial report with the Department of Public Instruction;
- 10. That each district agrees to a calendar of 191 days length for program operation;
- 11. That the Service Contract Breakdown attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference includes the plan for operation and payments to the School District of the Menomonie Area by the school districts listed above; and

That notice of intent to non-renew this agreement by any participating district be in conformance with timelines prescribed in the Wisconsin Statutes 118.22 (2).
