- 11. Information. **a. Committee Reports**. (1) Negotiation Committee. The Negotiation committee met on July 29 to establish parameters and discuss salary increases for staff. "Meet and confer" sessions will be scheduled. The committee will update the board in closed session. **b. General Information**. None. **c. President's Report**. (1) Notice of Election in WASB Region 4. The notice of election for the Region 4 director was reviewed. Nominations must be submitted to the WASB's Madison office, and postmarked by September 5, 2015. The election will be held at the October 14 Fall Regional Meeting. (2) WASB/CESA 10 Workshops. The WASB will offer regional workshops at CESA 10 on August 12 and November 4. All board members will attend the "Key Work of School Boards" session on August 12. (3) Fall Regional Meeting and Workshop. The Fall Regional Meeting will be held on October 14 at the Holiday Inn Eau Claire South, starting at 6:00 p.m. The meeting follows an optional workshop scheduled from 4 to 6:00 p.m. (4) WASB Webinar Schedule 2015/16. The webinar schedule was reviewed.

The 2015-17 state budget (2015 Wisconsin Act 55) legislates additional notice obligations including requirements that school districts notify parents and guardians about academic standards, and the educational options available to resident students. Additionally, districts are required to provide a copy of the schools accountability report cards and most recent rankings, and parents of children with a disability are to be provided with information about the special needs voucher program. As the first step, the requirement regarding academic standards requires that school boards adopt academic standards each year prior to the parental notification. (a) Review of Academic Standards for 2015/16 School Year. An amended version of the Academic Standards for 2015/16 was presented. See 12.b. (2) On Track for the Future! Building Projects Update. The Market & Johnson progress update for June-July 2015 was distributed, and drone video content as of July 31 was viewed. Bids for the water and sewer project are due August 6. (3) All School Reunion. Dr. Biedron attended the All School Reunion events on August 1, and shared highlights. (4) Cluster A Administrative Retreat. RESOLUTION NO. 7A-15PC

RESOLUTION APPROVING A PROJECT PLAN AMENDMENT FOR TAX INCREMENTAL DISTRICT NO. 3 CITY OF ALTOONA, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, the City of Altoona (the "City") has determined that use of Tax Incremental Financing is required to promote development and redevelopment within the City; and

WHEREAS, Tax Incremental District No. 3 (the "District") was created by the City on September 13, 2001 as a blighted area district; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to amend the Project Plan of the District in accordance with the provisions of Section 66.1105, Wisconsin Statutes (the "Tax Increment Law"); and

WHEREAS, such amendment will remove Section 10.1 Land Sale Revenues from the Original Tax Incremental District 3 Project Plan approved September 13, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has prepared an amended Project Plan for the District (the "Amendment") that includes:

- a. A statement listing of the kind, number and location of all proposed public works or improvements within the District, or to the extent provided in Sections 66.1105(2)(f)1.k. and 66.1105(2)(f)1.n., Wisconsin Statutes, outside of the District;
- b. An economic feasibility study;
- A detailed list of estimated project costs;
- d. A description of the methods of financing all estimated project costs and the time when the related costs or monetary obligations are to be incurred;
- e. A map showing existing uses and conditions of real property in the District;
- f. A map showing proposed improvements and uses in the District;
- g. Proposed changes of zoning ordinances, master plan, map, building codes and City ordinances:
- h. A list of estimated non-project costs;
- i. A statement of the proposed plan for relocation of any persons to be displaced;
- j. A statement indicating how the amendment of the district promotes the orderly development of the City;
- k. An opinion of the City Attorney or of an attorney retained by the City advising that the plan is complete and complies with Section 66.1105(4)(f)., Wisconsin Statutes.

WHEREAS, prior to its publication, a copy of the notice of public hearing was sent to the chief executive officers of Eau Claire County, the Altoona School District, and the Chippewa Valley Technical College District, and any other entities having the power to levy taxes on property located within the District, in accordance with the procedures specified in the Tax Increment Law; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedures specified in the Tax Increment Law, the Plan Commission, on July 13, 2015 held a public hearing concerning the proposed amendment to the Project Plan, providing interested parties a reasonable opportunity to express their views thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Plan Commission of the City of Altoona that:

- 1. The boundaries of Tax Incremental District No. 3 remain unchanged as specified in Exhibit A of this Resolution
- 2. It approves the amended Project Plan for the District, attached as Exhibit B, and recommends its approval to the Common Council.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE PROJECT PLAN OF TAX INCREMENTAL DISTRICT NO. 3, CITY OF ALTOONA, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, the City of Altoona (the "City") has determined that use of Tax Incremental Financing is required to promote development and redevelopment within the City; and

WHEREAS, Tax Incremental District No. 3 (the "District") was created by the City on September 13, 2001 as a blighted area district; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to amend the Project Plan of the District in accordance with the provisions of Section 66.1105, Wisconsin Statutes (the "Tax Increment Law"); and

WHEREAS, such amendment will remove Section 10.1 Land Sale Revenues after January 1, 2015 from the Original Tax Incremental District 3 Project Plan approved September 13, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has prepared an amended Project Plan for the District (the "Amendment") that includes:

- a. A statement listing of the kind, number and location of all proposed public works or improvements within the District, or to the extent provided in Sections 66.1105(2)(f)1.k. and 66.1105(2)(f)1.n., Wisconsin Statutes, outside of the District;
- b. An economic feasibility study;
- A detailed list of estimated project costs;
- d. A description of the methods of financing all estimated project costs and the time when the related costs or monetary obligations are to be incurred;
- e. A map showing existing uses and conditions of real property in the District;
- f. A map showing proposed improvements and uses in the District;
- g. Proposed changes of zoning ordinances, master plan, map, building codes and City ordinances;
- h. A list of estimated non-project costs;
- i. A statement of the proposed plan for relocation of any persons to be displaced;
- j. A statement indicating how the amendment of the district promotes the orderly development of the City;
- k. An opinion of the City Attorney or of an attorney retained by the City advising that the plan is complete and complies with Section 66.1105(4)(f)., Wisconsin Statutes.

WHEREAS, prior to its publication, a copy of the notice of public hearing was sent to the chief executive officers of Eau Claire County, the Altoona School District, and the Chippewa Valley Technical College District, and any other entities having the power to levy taxes on property located within the District, in accordance with the procedures specified in the Tax Increment Law; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedures specified in the Tax Increment Law, the Plan Commission, on July 13, 2015 held a public hearing concerning the proposed amendment to the Project Plan, providing interested parties a reasonable opportunity to express their views thereon; and

WHEREAS, after said public hearing, the Plan Commission adopted, and subsequently recommended approval to the Common Council an amended Project Plan for the District; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Altoona that:

- 1. The boundaries of "Tax Incremental District No. 3, City of Altoona", remain unchanged as specified in Exhibit A of this Resolution.
- That this Project Plan Amendment shall become effective as of the date of adoption of this resolution provided that it is further approved by the Joint Review Board.
- 3. The Common Council finds and declares that:
 - a. Not less than 50%, by area, of the real property within the District, as amended, is a blighted area within the meaning of Section 66.1105(2)(a)1. of the Wisconsin Statutes. Furthermore, at the time of adoption of the creation resolution for this District, and any subsequent resolutions amending its boundaries, any property standing vacant for seven years immediately preceding adoption of the resolution(s) did not comprise more than 25% of the total area in the District as required by Section 66.1105(4)(gm)1 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.
 - b. Based upon the findings, as stated in 3.a. above, and the original findings as stated in the Resolution creating the District, the District remains declared as a blighted area district based on the identification and classification of the property included within the District.
 - c. The improvement of such area is likely to enhance significantly the value of substantially all of the other real property in the District.
 - d. The amount of retail business will not change as a result of this amendment
 - e. The project costs of the District relate directly to promoting the elimination of blight of the area consistent with the purpose for which the District was created.
- 4. The amended Project Plan for "Tax Incremental District No. 3, City of Altoona" (attached as Exhibit B) is approved, and the City further finds the Plan is feasible and in conformity with the master plan of the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, within 60 days of adoption of the amendment, that this amendment has taken place pursuant to the provisions of Section 66.1105(5)(cm), Wisconsin Statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City Assessor is hereby authorized and directed to make notations to the assessment roll under Section 70.45 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make similar notations on the tax roll made under Section 70.65 of the Wisconsin Statutes, pursuant to Section 66.1105(5)(f) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

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SECTION 1:

Executive Summary

Description of District

Type of District, Size and Location

Tax Incremental District ("TID") No. 3 (The "TID" or "District") is an existing blighted area district, created by a resolution of the City of Altoona ("City") Common Council adopted on September 13, 2001 (the "Creation Resolution").

Amendments

The District was previously amended on September 11, 2003, whereby a resolution was adopted to add additional territory to the District, and to amend the list of projects to be undertaken. This amendment was the first of four territory amendments permitted for this District.

The District was previously amended on May 24, 2012 whereby a resolution was adopted to amend the list of projects to be undertaken.

Purpose of this Amendment

The purpose of this amendment is the removal of Section 10.1 ("Land Sale Revenues") from the original project plan document. TID No. 3 currently receives 30% of the proceeds from the sale of land located within the District. However, the City owned the land prior to creation of the District. Following the amendment, as of January 1, 2015, TID No. 3 will receive no proceeds from the sale of land.

Estimated Total Project Expenditures.

The proposed Project Plan Amendment will not add any project expenditures to the Original or Amended Project Plans of TID No. 3. The impact of the amendment will reduce the total revenues collected by the District. The projected cash flow of TID No. 3, without land sale proceeds, will provide sufficient funding to cover all existing and proposed TID No. 3 expenditures.

Economic Development

Existing and forecasted increment is projected to cover existing and proposed project costs.

Expected Termination of District

The District has a maximum statutory life of 27years, and must close not later than September 13, 2028, resulting in a final collection of increment in budget year 2029. Based on the projections in this amended project plan the expected termination of TID No. 3 is 2022.

Summary of Findings

As required by Wisconsin Statutes Section.66.1105, and as documented in this Project Plan Amendment and the exhibits contained and referenced herein, the following findings are made:

That "but for" amendment of the District's Project Plan, the remaining development projected
to occur as detailed in this Project Plan: 1) would not occur; or 2) would not occur in the
manner, at the values, or within the timeframe desired by the City. In making this determination,
the City has considered the following information:

- The proposed amendment does not add any new expenditures. The District is projected to cover all costs both existing and future with forecasted revenues. The loss of revenues from land sales is not projected to cause cash flow shortfalls in TID No. 3.
- 2. The economic benefits of amending the District, as measured by increased employment, business and personal income, and property value, are sufficient to compensate for the cost of the improvements. In making this determination, the City has considered the following information:
 - As demonstrated in the Economic Feasibility Section of this Project Plan amendment, the tax increments projected to be collected are more than sufficient to pay for the remaining proposed project costs. On this basis alone, the finding is supported.
- 3. The benefits of the proposal outweigh the anticipated tax increments to be paid by the owners of property in the overlying taxing jurisdictions.
 - Given that it is not likely that the District will achieve all of the objectives of its Project Plan or in the same manner without the continued use of tax incremental financing (see finding # 1), and since the District is expected to generate additional economic benefits that are more than sufficient to compensate for the additional cost of the improvements (see Finding #2), the City reasonably concludes that the overall additional benefits of the District outweigh the anticipated tax increments to be paid by the owners of property in the overlying taxing jurisdictions. It is further concluded that since the "but for" test is satisfied, there would, in fact, be no foregone tax increments to be paid in the event the Project Plan is not amended.
- 4. The boundaries of the District are not being amended. At the time of creation, and any subsequent additions of territory, not less than 50%, by area, of the real property within the District, as amended, is a blighted area within the meaning of Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105(2)(ae)1. At the time of adoption of the Creation Resolution for this District, and any subsequent resolutions amending its boundaries, any property standing vacant for seven years immediately preceding adoption of the resolution(s) did not comprise more than 25% of the total area in the District as required by Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105(4)(gm)1.
- 5. Based upon the findings as stated above, and the original findings as stated in the Creation Resolution and in any subsequent resolutions amending the boundaries of the District, the District remains declared a blighted area district based on the identification and classification of the property included within the District.
- The project costs will not change as a result of this amendment.
- 7. There are no additional improvements as a result of this amendment.
- The amount of retail business will not change as a result of this amendment.
- The Project Plan for the District, as amended, is feasible, and is in conformity with the Master Plan of the City.

SECTION 2:

Type and General Description of District

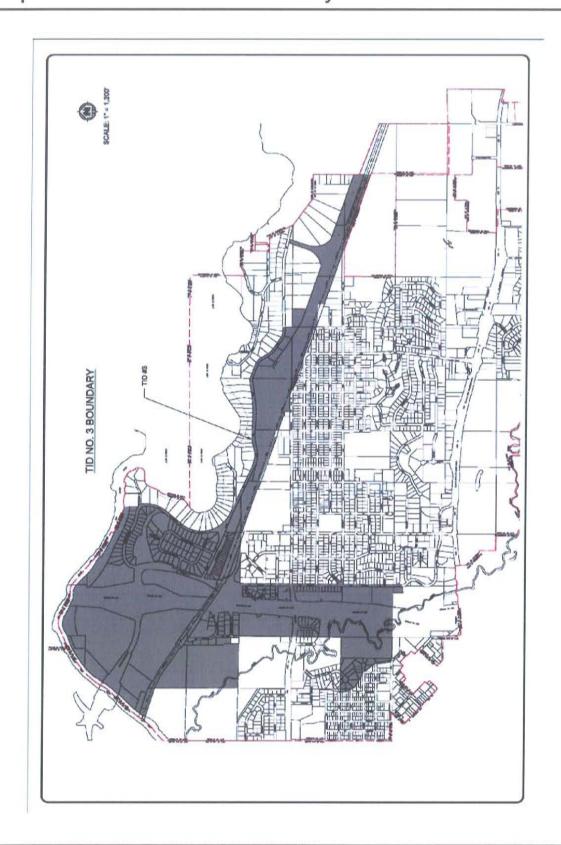
The District was created under the authority provided by Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105 on September 13, 2001 by resolution of the Common Council. The District's valuation date, for purposes of establishing base value, was January 1, 2001.

The District is a "Blighted Area District," created on a finding that at least 50%, by area, of the real property within the District was blighted, as defined in Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105(2)(ae)1. At the time of adoption of the Creation Resolution for this District, and any subsequent resolutions amending its boundaries, any property standing vacant for seven years immediately preceding adoption of the resolution(s) did not comprise more than 25% of the total area in the District as required by Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105(4)(gm)1. Since this amendment does not add any territory to the District, the District remains in compliance with these provisions.

Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105(4)(h)2 provides authority for a City to amend the boundaries of an existing Tax Increment District for purposes of adding and/or subtracting territory up to a total of four times during the life of the District. The boundaries of the District have been amended once prior to this Amendment. Since this amendment does not involve the addition or subtraction of territory from the District, it is not counted against the number of available boundary amendments.

This Project Plan Amendment supplements, and does not supersede or replace any component of the original Project Plan, or any component of previously adopted Project Plan Amendments, unless specifically stated. All components of the original Project Plan, and its previously adopted Project Plan Amendments, remain in effect.

A map depicting the current boundaries of the District is found in Section 3 of this Plan. Based upon the findings stated above, the original findings stated in the Creation Resolution, and the findings contained in any subsequent resolution adding territory to the District, the District remains a blighted area district based on the identification and classification of the property included within the District.



SECTION 4:

Map Showing Existing Uses and Conditions

There will be no change to District boundaries, nor any changes to the existing uses and conditions within the District as a result of this amendment. A copy of this map can be found in the Original and/or Amended Project Plan Documents.

SECTION 5:

Equalized Value Test

No additional territory will be added to the District. Demonstration of compliance with the equalized value test is not required for this Amendment.

SECTION 6:

Statement of Kind, Number and Location of Proposed Public Works and Other Projects

The purpose of this amendment is the removal of Section 10.1 Land Sale Revenues from the original project plan. Currently, TID No. 3 receives 30% of the land sale proceeds. With this amendment, as of January 1, 2015, TID No. 3 will receive no proceeds from the sale of land. This amendment does not supersede the Original or Amended Project Plans. All projects detailed in previous Project Plan documents remain eligible project costs of the district.

SECTION 7:

Map Showing Proposed Improvements and Uses

There will be no change to District boundaries, nor any changes to the proposed improvements or uses within the District as a result of this amendment. A copy of this map can be found in the Original and/or amended Project Plan documents.

SECTION 8:

Detailed List of Additional and Updated and Existing Project Costs

The proposed Project Plan Amendment will not add any project expenditures to the Original or Amended Project Plans of TID No. 3. The impact of the amendment will reduce the total revenues collected by the District.

SECTION 9:

Economic Feasibility Study, Financing Methods, and the Time When Costs or Monetary Obligations Related Are to

The proposed project plan amendment will not add any project expenditures to the Original or Amended Project Plans of TID No. 3. The impact of the amendment will be to reduce the total revenues collected by the District.

The information and exhibits contained within this Section demonstrate that the District, as proposed to be amended, will remain economically feasible insofar as:

- The City has available to it the means to secure the necessary financing required to accomplish
 the remaining projects contained within the Original and Amended Project Plans. A listing of
 "Available Financing Methods" follows.
- The City expects to complete the remaining projects (from the original plan or previous amendments) in one or more phases, and can adjust the timing of implementation as needed to coincide with the pace of private development. A discussion of the phasing and projected timeline for project completion is discussed under "Plan Implementation" within this Section. A table identifying the financing method for each phase and the time at which that financing is expected to incur is included.
- The development anticipated to occur as a result of the continued implementation of the TID No. 3 original and previously amendment project plans will generate sufficient tax increments to pay for the cost of the projects. Within this Section are tables identifying: 1) the development expected to occur, 2) an updated projection of tax increments to be collected resulting from that development and other economic growth within the District, and 3) an updated cash flow model demonstrating that the projected tax increment collections and all other revenues available to the District will be sufficient to pay all Project Costs.

Available Financing Methods

Implementation of this Plan may require that the City issue debt obligations to provide direct or indirect financing for the Projects to be undertaken. The following is a list of the types of obligations the City may choose to utilize.

General Obligation (G.O.) Bonds or Notes

The City may issue G.O. Bonds or Notes to finance the cost of projects included within this Plan. The

Wisconsin State Constitution limits the principal amount of G.O. debt that the community may have outstanding at any point in time to an amount not greater than five percent of its total equalized value (TID IN). As of the date of this plan, the City has a G.O. debt limit of \$26,788,785, of which \$10,096,231 is currently unused and could be made available to finance Project Costs.

Bonds Issued to Developers ("Pay as You Go" Financing)

The City may issue a bond or other obligation to one or more developers who provide financing for projects included in this Plan. Repayment of the amounts due to the developer under the bonds or other obligations are limited to an agreed percentage of the available annual tax increments collected that result from the improvements made by the developer. To the extent the tax increments collected are insufficient to make annual payments, or to repay the entire obligation over the life of the District, the City's obligation is limited to not more than the agreed percentage of the actual increments collected. Bonds or other obligations issued to developers in this fashion are not general obligations of the City and therefore do not count against the City's statutory borrowing capacity.

Tax Increment Revenue Bonds

The City has the authority to issue revenue bonds secured by the tax increments to be collected. These bonds may be issued directly by the City, or as a Lease Revenue Bond by its Community Development Authority (CDA) or by a Redevelopment Authority (RDA). Tax Increment Revenue Bonds and Lease Revenue Bonds are not general obligations of the City and therefore do not count against the City's statutory borrowing capacity. To the extent tax increments collected are insufficient to meet the annual debt service requirements of the revenue bonds, the City may be subject to either a permissive or mandatory requirement to appropriate on an annual basis a sum equal to the actual or projected shortfall.

Utility Revenue Bonds

The City can issue revenue bonds to be repaid from revenues of its various utility systems, including revenues paid by the City that represent service of the system to the City. There is neither a statutory nor constitutional limitation on the amount of revenue bonds that can be issued, however, water rates are controlled by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission and the City must demonstrate to bond purchasers its ability to repay revenue debt with the assigned rates. To the extent the City utilizes utility revenues other than tax increments to repay a portion of the bonds, the City must reduce the total eligible Project Costs in an equal amount.

Special Assessment "B" Bonds

The City has the ability to levy special assessments against benefited properties to pay part of the costs for street, curb, gutter, sewer, water, storm sewers and other infrastructure. In the event the City determines that special assessments are appropriate, the City can issue Special Assessment B bonds pledging revenues from special assessment installments to the extent assessment payments are outstanding. These bonds are not counted against the City's statutory borrowing capacity. If special assessments are levied, the City must reduce the total eligible Project Costs under this Plan in an amount equal to the total collected.

Plan Implementation

As stated in the Original and Amended Project Plans, projects identified will provide the necessary anticipated governmental services and/or development incentives to the remaining district. The order in which expenditures are made should be adjusted in accordance with development and execution of developer agreements, if any. The City reserves the right to alter the implementation of this Plan to accomplish this objective.

It is anticipated developer agreements between the City and property owners will be in place prior to major public expenditures. These agreements can provide for development guarantees or a payment in lieu of development. To further assure contract enforcement these agreements might include levying of special assessments against benefited properties.

The order in which expenditures are made should be adjusted in accordance with development and execution of developer agreements. The City reserves the right to alter the implementation of this Plan to accomplish this objective.

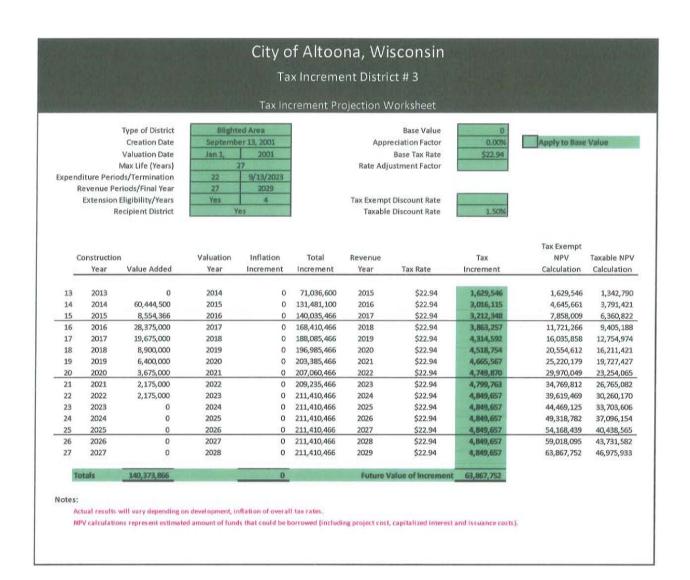
Interest rates projected are based on current market conditions. Municipal interest rates are subject to constantly changing market conditions. In addition, other factors such as the loss of tax-exempt status of municipal bonds or broadening the purpose of future tax-exempt bonds would affect market conditions. Actual interest expense will be determined once the methods of financing have been approved and securities or other obligations are issued.

If financing as outlined in this Plan proves unworkable, the City reserves the right to use alternate financing solutions for the projects as they are implemented.

It is expected that this Plan will be complementary to the City's Master Plan. There are no proposed changes to the Master Plan, map, building codes or other City ordinances for the implementation of this Plan.

SECTION 13:

Relocation

It is not anticipated there will be a need to relocate persons or businesses in conjunction with this Plan. In the event relocation or the acquisition of property by eminent domain becomes necessary at some time during the implementation period, the City will follow applicable Wisconsin Statutes chapter 32.

SECTION 14:

Orderly Development and/or Redevelopment of the City of Altoona

This Project Plan Amendment will have no impact on the viability of the original District Project Plan as it relates to the orderly development and/or redevelopment of the City.

SECTION 15:

List of Estimated Non-Project Costs

Non-Project Costs are public works projects that only partly benefit the District or are not eligible to be paid with tax increments, or costs not eligible to be paid with tax incremental finance funds. The City does not expect to incur any non-project costs in the implementation of this Project Plan.

WHEREAS, all JRB members were appointed and the first JRB meeting was held within 14 days after the notice was published under Wisconsin Statutes Sections 66.1105 (4)(a) and (e); and

WHEREAS, the JRB has reviewed the public record, planning documents, the resolution adopted by the Plan Commission approving the District amendment and adopting the Project Plan amendment, and the resolution passed by the Common Council approving the amendment of the District under Wisconsin Statutes Section 66.1105 (4)(gm); and

WHEREAS, the JRB has considered whether, and concluded that, the District continues to meet the following criteria:

- 1. The development expected in the District would not occur without the use of Tax Increment Financing and the amendment of a tax incremental district.
- The economic benefits of the District, as measured by increased employment, business
 and personal income and property value, are sufficient to compensate for the cost of the
 improvements.
- 3. The benefits of the proposal outweigh the anticipated tax increments to be paid by the owners of property in the overlying taxing districts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the JRB approves the Project Plan Amendment of Tax Incremental District No. 3.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the judgment of the JRB, the development described in the Project Plan, the information provided by the City, and the public record and planning documents relating to the District, would not occur without the amendment of the District.

- 3. Experience with heating, air-conditioning, plumbing, and electrical systems.
- 4. Must have mechanical aptitude and ability.
- 5. Has valid Wisconsin driver's license and a good driving record.
- 6. First Aid and CPR Certified (or secure within one semester).
- 7. Ability to lift and move 70 pounds.
- 8. Ability to perform all tasks of custodian.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. With Maintenance Team Supervisor, plans and oversees all building maintenance and repair work, maintaining a high standard of safety, cleanliness, and efficiency.
- 2. Works with the maintenance team supervisor/building principal to determine budget needs for the building.
- 3. Does snow removal and maintenance repairs on weekends and evenings as directed by the Maintenance Team Supervisor.
- 4. Does summer maintenance and cleaning projects as directed by the maintenance team supervisor/building principals.
- 5. Moves furniture as directed by principals/maintenance team supervisor.
- 6. Inspects fire alarm systems and fire extinguishers on a regularly scheduled basis, and coordinates same with maintenance team supervisor.
- 7. Makes recommendations to the maintenance team supervisor regarding major purchases.
- 8. Assists with the removal of snow, ice, athletic fields maintenance, and other related grounds work.
- 9. Strives constantly to promote the safety, health, and comfort of the students and employees.

- 10. Reports all major mechanical or functional problems to the maintenance team supervisor.
- 11. Checks and secures building at the end of the shift.
- 12. Takes care of minor repairs including plumbing, carpentry, and electrical.
- 13. Checks on and does preliminary maintenance for heating and cooling systems.
- 14. Maintains records as needed.
- 15. Maintains boilers and equipment in proper working condition.
- 16. Checks in supplies.
- 17. Delivers stock within the buildings.
- 18. Maintains all district HVAC units and vents.
- 19. Performs other duties as assigned.

Salary to be established by the Board. Evening and weekend repairs or snow removal call-ins are included in salary. Overtime will be granted only for rotated activities.

Performance of this job will be evaluated in accordance with the provisions of the Board's policy on evaluation of support personnel.

- 1. That said above parties agree and contract for the cooperation of the special education service as hereinafter set forth;
- 2. That the Eau Claire Area School District be the operator and fiscal agent;
- 3. That Eau Claire, as the fiscal agent, will include all program expenditures and receipts in Fund 27 of the Wisconsin Uniform Financial Accounting Requirements (WUFAR).
- 4. That the cost to the participating district be determined prior to June 30, annually, on the basis of participation and state aid reimbursements determined in the same manner and paid to the participating school districts;
- 5. That estimated budget and plan of operation for this cooperative shall be approved in advance of contract signing by all school district parties hereto;

- 6. That variations from the budget will require prior approval of the participating school districts hereto;
- 7. That unemployment compensation for the service provider will be the responsibility of the participating districts and based on percentage of use;
- 8. That the participating districts agree to prepay the host district according to the following schedule: One invoice will be mailed in November 2015 with the option of one or two installments, the first due in November 2015 and the second in January 2016.
- 9. That Eau Claire, as the fiscal agent, agrees to file the required financial report with the Department of Public Instruction;
- 10. That each district agrees to a calendar of 35 weeks for program operation, which allows for the variances in the contracting districts' calendars.
- 11. That notice of intent to non-renew this agreement by any participating district be in conformance with timelines prescribed in the Wisconsin Statutes 118.22 (2).
